We made a serious effort to get rid of the wood that we could not give away despite a sign at the street stating free fire wood. We had been trying to hide it for years as some of the pieces were too big for our chipper. But more on that in a bit. We started out 2024 with a bit of bang so to speak with a significant structural repair required on the chapel, additional details are contained later in our newsletter.

Theta Chi came to help us with Spring and Fall clean up—those young men are so appreciated for all their hard work. They never cease to amaze us on what they accomplish.

We had the grounds ready for Memorial Day as has consistently been our goal. Nancy has taken off a week from work the week prior to Memorial Day to get the grounds mowed and Wayne string trimmed.

We can't thank all of you enough for your ongoing support of the cemetery. It truly means so much to us that you care as much as we do!



The Story of the Disappearance of the Wood

The trees in the cemetery have been providing us surprise gifts for years. But each time something came down, we got out the chain saws, cut it up and removed it from the grounds. Some we chipped into mulch and some had to moved to its hiding spot. Late 2022 we started talking about what we could do to get rid of it as even though we were offering free fire wood and folks would come take truck loads we were running out of hiding spaces.


So we decided to get a dumpster that would take the wood to be recycled. A plan was born!

The first dumpster we got was a 20 yard dumpster and some of our neighbors came and helped us load the 1st dumpster. It was filled to capacity within a few hours.

So we called the dumpster company and requested a pick up of the first dumpster and had a second one delivered for the following weekend.

But we kept hauling in more branches, etc from out in the cemetery and that third dumpster filled up faster than we could have imagined.


Thank you so much Theta Chi!

Chapel/Office Repairs

In January 2024 we requested a quote from a contractor we used previously to repair/restore several of the mausoleums many years ago to repair a pillar holding up the portico of the chapel/office. The chapel was built in 1910 and was one of the last structures Frank Meade did prior to his partnership Hamilton. They went on to design and build many of the structures that were on what was known as Millionaire's row in Cleveland.

What they found upon inspection was that the brick under the stucco finish was severely compromised and needed to be replaced. So if you have been in the cemetery over the past month you have watched the deconstruction of this pillar and the rebuilding of same. It has been amazing to watch what has happened and we will share some pictures below so you can get an appreciation of

Chapel/Office Repairs



First they had to support the portico using angle iron and then they removed all the old brick.

They dug down below the frost line and poured a concrete footer before beginning the process of rebuilding.

A cement block base was added on that with rebar and then backfilled with more cement along with the steel support in the middle.
